Last Call for Luminaries! The deadline to order Christmas Eve luminaries from the United Women in Faith (UMW) is TODAY. These luminaries will brighten St. James' walkways 4:30-8:30PM on Christmas Eve. Luminaries cost \$3 each and may be purchased in honor or in memory of loved ones. Order forms are available in the weekly email, on the Welcome Center counter, and in the back of both worship spaces. Completed orders can be dropped into worship offering plates or the office door-drop with payment made to UMW.

Christmas Eve Special Offering: This year our Christmas Eve special offering will benefit the Methodist Home for Children. Please note MHC on your Christmas Eve offering.

*Christmas Eve Worship Times: We will offer 2 Christmas Eve worship services: the 5PM Common Thread service will be held in Carson Hall, with options to sit in cars or on the patio (weather permitting) for those who choose to do so. The 7PM traditional service will be held in the sanctuary. Both services will feature Holy Communion and candle-lighting. Nursery will not be available so that children can worship together with their families.

***Christmas Day Worship:** On Christmas Day, we will offer one combined service at 10AM in the sanctuary, with no discipleship classes meeting that Sunday. Dress is casual and children may bring one quiet toy to share. Nursery will not be available so that children can worship together with their families.

***Office Closing for Christmas:** Our office hours will be shortened over the holidays to allow our staff to spend time with their families. The office will be closed on December 26-27 and January 2. The office will be open on December 28-29, and on regular hours (9am-2pm Monday-Thursday) beginning January 3.

Church contributions for 2022 must be postmarked, made online, or brought to the church by Saturday, December 31, 2022 to be included on 2022 giving statements. Offerings made on January 1 should be clearly dated for either 2022 or 2023.
